

EDITORIAL

Dear residents of Horsford - well where do I start. It has been the oddest, scariest, most difficult, busy yet simple and sedate of times. Its difficult to know what to write without knowing what everyone has experienced over this last few months. Whilst wishing and hoping all those reading this to have come out of this unscathed - I know that for some - that is not the case. Therefore without wanting to trivialise events - I hope its possible to come out of this experience stronger and united as individuals, as family, as friends and as a village.

This is the first issue since lock-down having to make the decision to shelve the May 2020 edition of the magazine. For the first time in the magazines history - that's the first time an edition has been missed - but for obvious reasons. The world just seemed to stop. The term 'Lock-down' was a phrase only heard of in a movie. There was no school, businesses paused, no personal contact. Aside from the fact that the magazine could not be physically printed - there was very little to talk about with everything else to worry about. But also - there is little point in advertising a business – that is unable to Trade. I know we are not quite out of the woods yet - but hopefully we are well on track for a return to a new normality!

Paying tribute to the seriousness of the last few months, I know that I am one of the lucky ones. The loss of a holiday is nothing compared to what some have experienced. 2020 will go down in history as the year that everyone lost something. Whether it's a loved one, health, education, business or a lifetime event such as a wedding or a holiday - I'm sure it will shape what we do and how we do things in the future.

I found the early days of lock-down really strange. There was a run on toilet rolls! Delivery slots were hard to come buy if at all. Furlough was not a well known phrase, Zoom was fast-becoming as popular as Facebook as a means of communicating, Tik Tok was not a noise the clock made and working from home all of a sudden became a very normal thing to do.

Latterly - worries about health have subsided with greater anxiety about when I can get my hair done. Having seemingly changed my hair with every colour of the rainbow during lock-down and naturally supporting NHS blue for a good 2-3 weeks - thank goodness Bo-jo allowed salons to open early July. My husband however has clearly seen this as an opportunity to save money – clearly in no rush with him and the kids sporting cuts last seen in the 1970s!

It would be so wrong to focus purely on the negatives that this experience has created. Having watched the news religiously for updates and seen the good things that people have been doing - the key-workers and by that I don't just mean the NHS workers. Delivery drivers, supermarket workers, bin men, public transport drivers, cleaners and those teachers that enabled the key workers to do their stuff to name a few - amazing! 'Clapping for carers' became a weekly event and what about those on our doorstep - the Horsford Helpers! I would like to say a great big 'thank-you' for being here, there and everywhere to help those that needed the extra help most.

One thing that really impressed me was just how adaptable we have all become and especially



those businesses and clubs that rely on the physical participation. I'm sure there are many however I was so impressed with the efforts of the cubs and Scouts to maintain their weekly routines – giving two of my kids a reason to give the Xbox a break. The innovation of virtual camps and creativity of online activities has given them a chance to socialise – albeit from a distance – but helped retain an element of normality. Similarly – Master Wayne and his SESMA Sanseis' demonstrated that Jo Wicks was not the only option to keep fit from the living room with daily live workouts that really gave my husband no excuse to put on any weight during lockdown.

There have however been some business casualties though and one that I have got to mention is the closure of the Pre-school I think this is going to be a massive loss to the village. Having supported the pre-school by taking all three of my children there over the years and having at some point been the Chairperson – its such a shame that this service is closing after 51 years! I do hope there is an opportunity in the future for this to rise again from the ashes.

It has also been a time to realise just what is on our doorstep. I like a walk – and happily drag the dog for a

bit of a trek as Horsford has plenty of public footpaths to explore. It has been good to see so many people getting out and about to enjoy them and encouraged me to venture out further. Never before have I considered walking to Taverham or Drayton – but the route is so simple and scenic through Marriotts Way. It's a shame that we now have to visit the next village for a pint in a pub but lets hope the Social club will open again soon!

Finally – just a mention for all the local businesses. This must have been the most difficult and uncertain of times. I am hoping though that there are good times ahead. The Horsford News is here for you to promote the products and services that you provide in a medium that now reaches almost 2000 houses. Your support keeps the magazine running and I will continue to keep rates at these competitive levels for the foreseeable.

NEWS FROM THE COUNCIL

The Parish Council has been in lockdown since March and government guidance is that they should not meet in public at the moment. Essential business has been managed by the Clerk in consultation with the Chairman and members.

At the March meeting, before lockdown, the Clerk gave notice to terminate his employment having carried out that role for 21 years and as a member of the Council for 24 years before that. Obviously the onset of the pandemic has hampered the recruitment process but a short list has been prepared from fourteen applications and, regulations permitting, interviews will be held in August.

The installation of play equipment at Park View as a joint venture with Broadland D.C. has been completed satisfactorily and at their first "virtual" meeting in July, the Parish Council confirmed that they would proceed with two more projects at Beckside and Coltsfoot Road, again on a 50/50 basis with BDC.

Sealed bids for the proposed toilets on the recreation ground were opened and the successful bidder selected. The Parish Council will fund this project before giving it to the Village Hall Committee to own and manage into the future. It will be referred back to the Village Hall Committee before starting as there may well be modification to the specification due to the implications of COVID19.

The Council are very appreciative of the voluntary help given to the elderly and vulnerable in the village and hope to develop more formalised arrangements should the need arise in the future.

Concern has been expressed by the Council at the application for 280 holiday units at Haveringland Hall and in particular the traffic implications for Holt Road. These concerns will be submitted formally to the planning authority.

There have been changes going on with the VHMC in that Andrew Drummee has decided to relinquish his dual roles of Secretary and Treasurer, although he is going to remain a Trustee. The Secretary position has been taken on by Jayne Burdett and any questions or concerns regarding the Village Hall should be sent to Jayne in the first instance at jayne.burdett@btinternet.com

Jo Keeler will be taking over from Andrew as Treasurer in due course, dealing with the financial aspects of managing the Village Hall.

Jo Keeler and Angela Makinson are working on a project to refurbish the Village Hall. The first area to feel the benefit of their attention, is the Committee Room. It is hoped that in the future the Committee Room will attract daytime hirers and there may even be the possibility of having a Community Café when life returns to 'normal'. Talking about returning to 'normal' Jo and Angela are also working on the safeguarding measures that have to be taken, following Government guidelines, to re-open the Village Hall and make it Covid-19 safe for our users. This is a complex piece of work and a Risk Assessment is being prepared ready for discussion at the next VHMC meeting on 13 July.

BUSINESS ACTION PLAN GROUP UPDATE

Play Area Project

At the last meeting of Horsford Parish Council, it was agreed that work could start on upgrading the remaining two Play Areas, Beckside and Coltsfoot, as the final part of the BAP Play Area Project. As with Park View, the residents in the area will receive details of the plans in advance of work starting.

Sale of The Dog Public House

The BAP Group have been monitoring the situation regarding the sale of The Dog to establish whether any approach should be made to Horsford Parish Council to consider whether or not this building could be utilised by the village. The Agents say negotiations are taking place with an interested party. They will not allow anyone to view the building while these negotiations are going on. This means it is impossible to know the condition of the building and see what work would need to be carried out on it and whether this would be financially viable, particularly in the current economic climate.

Strengthening the Community

Horsford really came together during the pandemic and the BAP Group have merged two initiatives to look at how we can encourage the community spirit that has been experienced in the village since March. The first initiative is looking at activities we could provide for vulnerable people in the village. The focus had been on the elderly, but this pandemic has endorsed the fact that not all vulnerable people are elderly.

The second is looking at the possibility of having a Community Meeting, inviting representatives from the Clubs, Groups, Horsford Helpers, Places of Worship, Schools, Doctors, Dentist, Retail Outlets and Businesses in the village, to come together in an informal way and consider how we might encourage this community spirit. The Group would number around 20, to discuss whether or not this was a worthwhile exercise and if so, what the agenda for the initiative might be and how frequently the Group should meet. The hope being that this Group would work together to make the agenda a reality.

At the moment, such a meeting is not possible because of Government guidelines regarding meetings but it is hoped that later in the year, such a Community meeting might be a possibility.

Emergency Planning Framework

In order to be prepared if there were to be a second peak of Covid-19, BAP is working on the

possibility of a formal planning framework for the village and this will be discussed at the next meeting of Horsford Parish Council.

We learned that 'underlying health issues' also needed to include epilepsy, autism, dementia, Parkinson's disease, motor neurone disease, multiple sclerosis, a learning disability, cerebral palsy or diabetes and this is probably not a complete list. And what about the carers, both young and adult, in our community.









Community spirit in Horsford was amazing with a veritable army of people springing up spontaneously to help each other. We got to know people who had lived in our streets for years that we had never spoken to before and generally we became a kinder place to live. There were still a few spats on Horsford Life, but I guess that will always be the case.

Now Government guidelines are being relaxed and we have 'freedom' again, but life looks very different. My handbag now contains face masks, gloves, hand sanitiser and anti bacterial wipes. I am one of the people who was shielding so perhaps I am more cautious than others but as we approach the future, these are items we probably need to keep with us at all times.

Sadly, we need to be aware that with this new freedom comes the potential for an explosion in mental health and emotional support issues. Those people in our village who deal with loneliness and isolation every day, will probably have experienced a welcome surge in attention, akin to that following the death of a loved one, when everyone rallies round. However, as life moves on, the bereaved is left to deal with their grief alone. It is one thing to miss something you have never experienced; it is quite another to find that something you have become used to and welcomed, has gone away.

That is why, going forward into a new 'normal life', encouraging the kinder, more caring society is so important. Wellbeing is an expression bandied about a great deal these days but during the pandemic Horsford showed that we understood the word and spontaneously offered help and support in a very generous and caring way. We showed that the wellbeing of our community is important to us. Long may it last.

HOW CAN YOU KEEP YOUR RIVER HEALTHY AND CLEAN?

In a series of articles Norfolk Rivers Trust will provide advice to help maintain the health of our globally rare chalk streams and lowland rivers in Norfolk. In times of drought and hot weather it is especially important because of the wildlife our rivers support. Endangered white clawed crayfish, brown trout, eels, and water voles are just a few of the iconic species at risk in Norfolk and you can do your bit to help protect them.

Vegetation: while it is tempting to "tidy" the river by pulling out the plants, you are doing


more harm than good. The vegetation in the river helps in so many ways! Firstly, plants shade the channel reducing the temperature of the water and keeping the water oxygenated. Secondly, plants hold back water in exceptionally low flows allowing the invertebrates and fish to survive in the damp conditions. Thirdly, plants take up the excess nutrients and pollutants resulting in cleaner water downstream; plants act as natural filters. And lastly, by taking out the vegetation you are removing the essential food that most of the aquatic food chain relies on! If you feel the river is "choked" you can call the Environment Agency for advice but generally the vegetation dies down over winter.

MEGAN THE MARVELLOUS!

Megan is a gorgeous 12 year old Lurcher who was referred to us by a local practice with suspected heart disease. She was coughing intermittently and her vets had noted she had a heart murmur. Our Cardiologist Tom Robertson performed an ECG (a test which measures the electrical activity of the heart) and an Echocardiogram (a scan used to look at the heart and nearby blood vessels). This showed that Megan had enlargement of the left atrium of her heart and thickened mitral valves, consistent with Myxomatous Mitral Valve Disease (MMVD). MMVD is a slowly progressive disease which usually progresses to heart failure over time. Medications were prescribed to manage her condition and her owners were informed to monitor Megan closely for symptoms of breathlessness, exercise intolerance, fainting and abdominal swelling.

Megans condition was stable for several months but sadly her condition did worsen recently and she returned for a repeat heart scan to check the progress of her disease. The scan revealed evidence of congestive heart failure. Megan was struggling to exercise and had lost her appetite. It was touch and go and her owners were prepared for the worst. Megans medications were adjusted and additional medications were prescribed in accordance with her changed condition. Wonderfully, Megan has made brilliant progress and is currently coping well on her new treatment regime. Her owners are so happy to have her with them and sent us these beautiful pictures of Megan loving life and being a typical goofy Lurcher on the beach on Christmas Dav.
