

Volunteers for Community Speed Watch: the Parish Council supports the Community Speed watch programme which is helping to address the problems of speeding in Horsford.

As part of the programme, Peter Rushbrook, the local Co-ordinator is seeking volunteers to help, about once a month, to monitor traffic at various locations around the village. Norfolk Constabulary provide training on the use of the equipment as well as the H&S aspects and you are covered by the Constabulary's insurance. Commitment in terms of your time is a few hours per month as you record the registration number of vehicles seen to breaking the speed limit.

Allotments: Corner Lane has recently had the hedge cut back which was causing a nuisance to neighbours as it grew through the fences whilst at Church Field the Lease has been renewed for a further 5 years at a slightly hire annual rent.

Planting around the village: a resident has kindly donated Lilies and other flowering shrubs which are currently being planted on the roundabouts, by the Village Sign and other locations around the village to bring some colour to these areas in the Spring.

HORSFORD VILLAGE HALL MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE (VHMC)

The Village Hall is starting to get very busy again as our regular hirers return and new hirers are starting different classes and activities. As well as the main Hall, the Committee Room is a versatile room that is available for meetings, presentations, small groups and get togethers. It has a smart TV and can deal with presentations and virtual meetings. Currently it is being used as our local Covid symptom-free testing venue where people have been able to just turn up and have an observed symptom-free rapid test.

Once again, this year there will be Christmas Carols outside the Village Hall with refreshments courtesy of the Social Club. This will be on 17 December at 7pm.

Any requests relating to hiring the Hall should be addressed to our Caretaker, Diane Baxter, on 01603 893900.

Young people are continuing to kick balls into the open area at the back of the social club and climbing up the fencing to try and get to them. Please would parents be very clear to their young people that this is extremely dangerous and if they want to get their ball back, Diane has kindly said that if she is contacted, on the above number, she will do what she can to get the ball returned.

Sadly we are also experiencing anti-social behaviour on the Recreation Ground and Play Areas. Some of the VHMC Trustees met with the Police recently to discuss how to deal with these situations. This behaviour affects everyone who uses the Recreation Ground and Play Areas.

The Police advise that any acts of anti-social behaviour should be reported either by calling 101 or via their Report It website https://www.norfolk.police.uk/contact-us/6-report-it#na This is important as the Police can then monitor patterns of behaviour and respond accordingly. The 999 number should only be used in emergencies.

The VHMC have a large number of CCTV cameras on the Recreation Ground too so if an issue is reported giving details of the issue along with the date and time, preferably in an email to our VHMC Secretary, Jayne Burdett, at jayne.burdett@btinternet.com or on 07577 45273, the authorised VHMC Trustees can check on the CCTV and share any relevant information with the Police. Any concerns or comments you have about any of the Recreation Ground facilities should also be addressed, via email in the first instance, to Jayne as above.

Even if you see something and wonder whether or not it is worth reporting, the answer is that, yes, it is worth reporting either to the Police or to the VHMC Secretary.

BUSINESS ACTION PLAN GROUP (BAP) UPDATE

OUTPOST, Horsford's youth group, which is run by YMCA, is now using the large Hall which gives them a lot more scope and means that more young people can attend and enjoy all the activities on offer. There was a pizza evening recently and a film night is being considered if anyone can agree on which film to watch! OUTPOST is for 11 – 16-year-olds, they meet on a Thursday evening between 6-8 pm and it is free to attend. Most of the original young people have returned following lockdown and new people are starting to come along as well. Please encourage your young people to come along and bring their friends.

Green Infrastructure Plan for Horsford

The goal of this plan is to retain and protect Horsford's green space, and to provide increased enjoyment for the residents within it. To achieve this, work is being done to develop the plan and include projects in it that work towards the goal.

This is in line with the objectives of the Horsford Neighbourhood Plan by looking at ways our residents can use the woods and the Pits to provide quiet areas for reflection, walking routes with better information boards, cycling and generally improve wellbeing from being in the fresh air and enjoying the nature we have around us.

Extreme Sports

Work is starting to look at the feasibility of providing a mountain bike track at Pyehurn Pit which has been used for quite some time as a bikers' track. It is one of the village assets that is maintained and administered by Horsford Parish Council with a board of Horsford Pit Trustees. The purpose of this project is to encourage more cyclists to get on their bikes and have extra fun in our green spaces not only through the dry seasons but all year round. Scooter and BMX riders could also use the parts of the track that they are comfortable with.

Horsford Transport Policy

There were over 600 responses to the Transport Survey which is around 12% of the people in Horsford. The analysis of the responses reveals no real surprises – the top three were speeding, volume of traffic and the number of HGVs going

through the village. In the category relating to the roads surrounding the respondent's home, parking was also a strong issue.

The next stage is to start working on time frames and costs for work to be done in developing a short policy statement, accompanied by a concept masterplan and the cost of any detailed design work that might or might not be needed. Once this is agreed the development work will start, we will begin meeting with NCC Highways and an open evening will be arranged when parishioners can come along and see how the input they have provided can be used to develop the Horsford Transport Policy.



How to avoid investment mistakes

In you are a first-time investor you may be daunted by taking a step into the unknown, especially if you have heard something about the potential risks, but not enough to be certain you can avoid them. This article highlights several potential investment mistakes and how to avoid them.

Not having a strategy is one risk. Investment is not a matter of luck, and certainly not about picking out investments at random. It needs a coherent strategy, which removes guesswork and investment not just into a planned route to your goals, but one with quantifiable progress mileposts along the way. The planning starts with understanding what you want from your investment. Capital growth or income, or a combination of both. What risk can you afford to take, what are your timeframes, what are your wealth targets and what can you commit to reach them?

You need to know the answers to these questions – and understand the impact they have on the investments that are right for you.

Understanding risk is vital. There are no guarantees with investing. Any investment opportunity carries some risk, and the general rule is that the greater potential returns, the greater is the risk. But some risk is actually desirable. Without some risk you may not be able to reach your financial targets. You must

also understand the risk inherent in each investment you make. A UK government bond is seen as low risk, while shares in a small business enterprise may be much higher risk. Low-risk investments usually restrict you to low, steady returns. Higher risk may mean the chance of higher returns that arrive much faster but may also carry a higher risk of loss.

Ideally, you want a portfolio made up of investments with a range of risk. How that portfolio is made up will depend on your attitude to risk, investment strategy and such factors as the time you have to reach your wealth goals.

Having a diversified portfolio of investments, made up of different investment types, can help to reduce risk. When one part of the market dips, another will hopefully rise. One common mistake that DIY investors make is too much emphasis on home bias – investing in UK companies that they've heard of – rather than taking a more global approach.

Investing allows you to buy shares in companies and share in their potential profits. However, over

short periods volatility in the price can hide any gains so investing over the longer term – at least 5 years - works best as it can benefit from compound growth.

THE START OF THE PARISH COUNCIL

When I was Clerk to the Parish Council I deposited all pre-millennium council minutes in the County Record Office. Before doing so, I had a quick look at the first five years of Horsford Parish Council

Aparish meeting was called on December 4th.1894 to discuss the formation of a Parish Council under the new Local Government Act. Nomination papers were handed in and a show of hands taken. A member of the public then demanded that a proper poll be taken and this was held on Dec.17th. The Parish Council met for the first time on New Year's Eve 1894. Descendants of many of the original councillors still live in the parish today. The original nine were Messrs. Andrews, March, Broom, Howe, Barrett-Lennard, Dack, Hill, Lacey and Day.

In 1895 the new Council got down to business. Mr.Warren was elected as Chairman. (It is interesting to note that in the early days the Chairman was not necessarily a councillor and more often a prominent local landowner). One of the first resolutions was to ask the Clerk to write to the Vicar and ask for all papers rightfully belonging to the Council. Hitherto any local documentation had been kept in the Parish Chest and this was the start of a lengthy feud between the Vicar and this new "upstart" Council. Eventually a combined deputation of councillors from Horsford and St.Faiths was sent to the vicarage to demand an inspection of the chest. This proved to be fruitless. The Council circulated 150 copies of a letter to all parishioners asking if they would like an allotment and also a questionnaire asking about the state of their living accommodation including "Is your roof watertight?" and "Is there a good well nearby?" Mr.March objected strongly to the cost of sending out these circulars (10/6) but was out voted. As a result of the demand for allotments, the search went on for suitable land and eventually 8 acres were leased from Steward & Patterson's brewery opposite the chapel and this was divided into eleven plots. The G.P.O. were asked to authorise a savings bank and money order office in the village and the Council agreed to undewrite this venture by guaranteeing the turnover!

1896 saw a resolution of the Parish Chest issue. The chest was taken to neutral ground and examined. Something of an anticlimax as with the exception of some papers relating to the roads of the Parish all other documents were ecclesiastical! There was still a great demand for allotments but no land could be found and the Council wrote to the County Council asking for compulsory purchase powers, an issue which rumbled on for several years. Leisure activity obviously played no part in the life of Horsford as a proposition to try and purchase a recreation ground did not even find a seconder and was not discussed further. The youth of the village obviously found early council meetings a source of entertainment for, after complaints of damage by the school managers, a resolution was passed excluding all boys and young men under the age of twenty from council meetings.

1897 was the first year of the post office subsidy ! A cheque for £2/3/2 was sent to the GPO for "losses at the savings bank". When I first read this I thought it was theft but then realised that this was the sum required to subsidise the running costs of this new facility. By this time, councillors were regularly being elected by show of hands at the annual meeting and the initial enthusiasm for local democracy seems to have waned as the turnout was only about one third of that at the first meeting. (Remember that the ladies of the parish did not vote and the only mention up to now of the fairer sex was Mrs.Blythe who was paid 5/- a year to light the fire in the school room and get it ready for the Council meetings. The quest for allotment land continued and Mr.Cook was asked to give up Church Field for this purpose but he replied that if this were to happen he would have to sack one labourer and sell two horses so that idea came to nothing. A meeting was convened to discuss how to mark Queen Victoria's Diamond Jubilee but as this was not a Council meeting, it was not minuted so we are none the wiser! It was at this stage that I noticed that Holt Road from the Crown (now the Indian Restaurant) to New Row cottages was always referred to as Dog Street and a proposal to install two additional street lights (presumably oil fired) was defeated.

1898 found the post office still struggling and the subsidy increased to £2/3/8. Most of the meetings in that year were dominated by discussions on allotments or rather the lack of them and the money which could be made by letting the shooting rights at the various pits around the village. The shooting rights were put out to tender with the proceeds to be given to the poor of the parish. The Council also enquired what would be necessary to have the services of a Norwich Fire engine.

In 1899 there was a threat to withdraw the post office altogether and a special meeting of the Council together with "ratepayers" gave a vote of confidence to Mr.Wade the postmaster and drew up a petition to be sent to GPO headquarters in London. The Council also learnt that it would cost £6 per year for the services of a Norwich fire engine and quickly concluded that by the time that the alarm had been raised and the engine had arrived (horse-drawn) it would be of little use and the matter was dropped.

By 1900 doubts had been expressed about the legality of tendering the shooting rights and the Council resolved to bank the money pending further information. Subsequently the District Auditor ruled that the rights belonged to the District Council and £3/18/0 was paid to them. By that time a Mr.Jolley had been elected to the Council and obviously intent on making his mark

he proposed that the District Council be urged to provide a Hospital for Contagious Diseases and that the Parish Council provide a "Bathing Place" for the parishioners. Neither proposition found a seconder and no further discussion took place. The Post Office trade had picked up and the subsidy was 14/10 (74p in new money!!)

And so Horsford set forth into the 20th.century to experience motor cars, aeroplanes, two world wars, space travel and the internet.

Taverham // vets

Freddie was brought home by his owners at 8 weeks old and had diarrhoea ever since. He initially was still bright and active despite this but over a few days Freddie became gradually quieter and had some vomiting. His owners brought him in to see us and unfortunately got the news that all puppy owners dread; Freddie had tested positive for parvovirus.

Parvovirus is a highly contagious viral infection that is often fatal. It attacks the rapidly dividing cells in the body, most severely affecting the gastrointestinal tract. This affects the bodies' ability to absorb nutrients and can also affect the heart and lungs of infected animals. Symptoms of parvovirus include diarrhoea with or without blood, vomiting, loss of appetite, lethargy, collapse, fever and can even cause sudden death.

Our Taverham team got to work right away treating Freddie. He was intensively nursed in isolation for several days. He was placed on intravenous fluids and given intravenous medication to help relieve his symptoms. Freddie's super personality shone through at all stages during his hospitalisation and he would often try and clamber on us for cuddles or wag his tail excitedly whenever he saw we were coming to give his treatments!

After 4 days of intensive treatment and roundthe-clock-care from our dedicated team Freddie was well enough to go home! Big well done to Freddie and his lovely Mum and Dad who have been continuing Freddie's care at home. Taverham Vets have since seen Freddie for his all-important vaccinations and are pleased to report he has made a full recovery.

It is important to note that Freddie had received a first vaccination prior to going to his new home. Dogs that are not vaccinated, partially vaccinated, and puppies aged 6 weeks to 6 months old are most likely to catch parvovirus. It is rare for fully vaccinated dogs to develop parvovirus.
